

Sports Premium Funding Report 2017/18

Introduction

The Government provided an additional funding to schools per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools.

Purpose of Funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but have freedom to choose how they do this. At Carr Manor Community School we recognise the contribution of PE to both the health and wellbeing of our pupils. We also believe that a varied PE curriculum and wide ranging activities have a positive effect on our pupil's concentration, attitude and academic achievement.

2017 - 18 Spending Plan

Carr Manor Community School expects to receive approximately £16,000 in Sports Premium Funding. The funding will be used to continue to raise standards and aspirations in Physical Education and to further widen the range of different sports and physical activities in and out of School. The money will be used to ensure all children in the school will benefit from the funding, regardless of their sporting ability.

This is an outline of how we intend to spend the 2017/18 Sports Premium and the outcomes we aim to deliver.

Aim	Desired Impact/Outcome
Sports Equipment	To replenish old sports equipment and add to equipment to enable PE lessons to be resourced fully. To invest in new equipment that supports skills progression for older children (KS2).
PE Specialist Teachers	Each child will get at least 2 hours per week of specialist PE teaching. We will continue to work with our Specialist PE team in Secondary Phase. Primary Phase staff will continue to support PE lessons to enhance their skills.
Sports Events	To hold a minimum of 3 sports events this year. In addition, we will participate in a number of sports fixtures and competitions with other school and through the cluster.
Active Schools Level Agreement	To renew the SLA with Active Schools. This will allow children from all year group to participate in different sporting activities and events.
New and additional sports clubs	To Provide places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs. To introduce new clubs, including indoor athletics, football and dance, to allow pupils to enjoy participating in various activities.

2016 - 17 Spending Outcome

The level of funding that Carr Manor Community School received in 2016/17 was £8445. This is an outline of how the 2016/17 Sports Premium was spent and its impact.

Amount	Spent on	Actual Impact/Outcome
£515	Sports equipment	New resources allowed us to provide more sporting activities. We purchased small helmets for pupils to wear when using the climbing wall in Secondary Phase building; new football kits for pupils to wear during fixtures.
£1690	Hiring external facilities	All Y3 children participated in swimming lessons every week. Pupils enjoy their swimming lessons and we will continue to hire the facilities in the next academic year.
£3,861	To ensure children are receiving PE each week	All primary children received at least 2 hours per week of specialist PE teaching. KS2 pupils use the Secondary Phase facilities and occasionally work with Y9 pupils as part of their Study School curriculum. Participation and attitude of pupils toward PE is much more positive. In addition, Primary Phase children participated in 3 sports days. Working with Secondary Phase pupils built the children's confidence in sports and encouraged them to try new sporting activities. Primary Phase pupils' achievements in sport were celebrated in our sports presentation afternoon.
£5,067	Lunch time staffing to increase pupils' participation in active play	Encouraged children to be physically active outside at playtimes. In addition, we purchased bikes for Reception pupils; balls; bean-bags and bats to enhance play time provision.
£1,200	Active Schools Service Level Agreement	Provided the opportunity to participate in various activities and competitions with other schools. Provided staff CPD.
