


## Progress 8

Progress 8 is the government's new way of measuring a school's success. It means, on average, how much progress children make across 8 subjects with 0 representing targets met and a positive score indicating targets exceeded.

For the second year in a row, pupils at Carr Manor have made progress significantly greater than the national average. This year, results see pupils exceed the national average by 0.34, another year on year improvement from our strong results last year. This is above average performance, and includes very good outcomes in the reformed and widely acknowledged more challenging English and Maths GCSEs. ## Headlines

- 51% achieved a strong pass (5 or above) in English or English Literature
- 1 in 4 pupils achieved the highest grades (9-6) in English or English Literature
- 40% of pupils gained at least three qualifications at the highest levels of A\*-B grades or equivalent
- 20% of all qualifications achieved were at A\*/A or equivalent level
- Grade 9s (top 5% nationally) awarded in English, English Literature and Mathematics
- A third of all pupils left with one or more A\*/A grades or equivalent
- Above 95% pass rates in BTEC Business, Sport, Performing Arts, Health & Social Care and Art & Design

## English Baccalaureate

Seen by the government as a 'gold standard' of GCSE subjects, including: English, mathematics, science, a language and either history or geography.

50% of the children at Carr Manor studied this pathway in 2017 (37% is the 2016 national average).

58% of these achieved a pass in all English Baccalaureate subjects.
